HOW TO FIND US FROM THE AIRPORT

London Heathrow

A direct bus service runs between Heathrow airport and Reading train station. Buses run every 30 minutes, during the day, and take about 40 minutes. For more information, please visit the RailAir website (<https://www.firstgroup.com/berkshire-thames-valley/more/rail-air>)

London Gatwick

A direct train service runs between Gatwick airport and Reading train station. Trains run once an hour, during the day, and take about 75 minutes. For more information please visit the National Rail website (<http://www.nationalrail.co.uk/>).

HOW TO FIND US FROM LONDON

If you are travelling from or via London, the quickest route to take is from London Paddington station. Trains from London Paddington to Reading run approximately every 15-20 minutes throughout the day and the average journey time is around 30 minutes. HOW TO FIND US BY BUS

Getting to Whiteknights campus from the centre of Reading is easy. The 21 and 21a buses run from Reading train station in the town centre to our Whiteknights campus at regular intervals, 24 hours a day. Once you arrive at the train station you can walk or cycle to either campus. If you choose to take a taxi or bus, the bus stops and taxi rank can be found outside the station. A taxi will cost you approximately £8 and a single bus journey will cost you £2 (You will need the exact money as the buses do not give change).

THE CEDARS HOTEL

The Cedars Hotel is located at the heart of the Whiteknights campus, to help find your way around campus please view our Map. Please note our reception is situated in Park House, a separate building to the hotel. Park House is just a short walk around the corner from the hotel and is highlighted on the map. 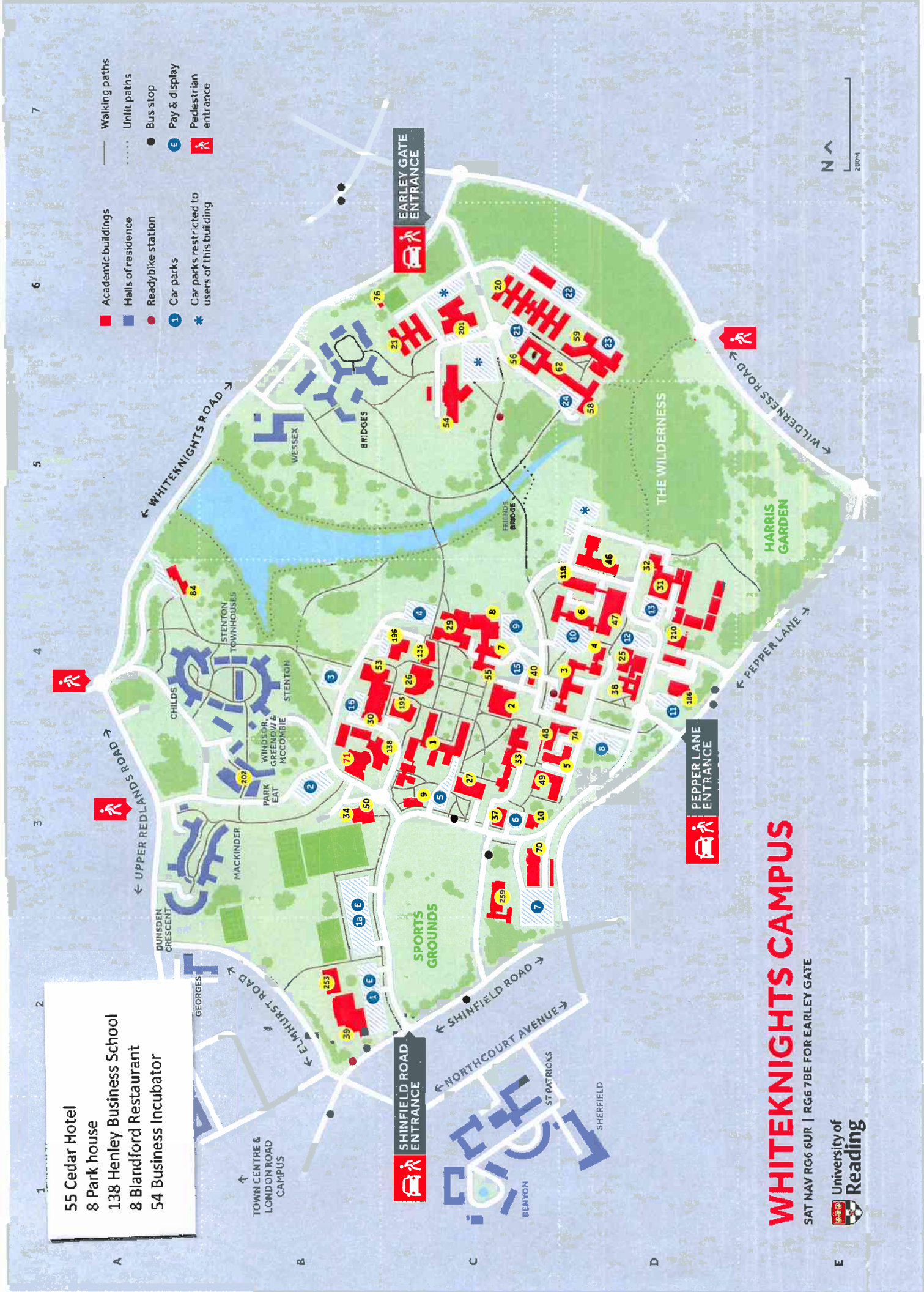
